

ANTIQUED RED TRUCK

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects



MATERIALS

MB1508 Vintage Truck Container
Liner Brush
Large Brush
Medium Brush
Clean Water

COLORS

CMM 90 - Red Hot CMM 44 - Battleship CMM 70 - Star Dust CMM 93 - London Fog CMM 31 - Licorice



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Start by painting the truck with 3 coats of Red Hot.
- 2. Use your detail brush to paint the license plates with 3 coats of London Fog.
- 3. Paint the hubcaps with 3 coats of Battleship using a small brush.
- 4. Next we are going to paint the bumpers and the grill with 3 coats of Battleship.
- 5. To paint the details on the grill we are going to apply 2 coats of Star Dust using a liner brush.
- 6. Paint the tires with 3 coats of Star Dust.
- 7. We are leaving the windows and lights unpainted for now, we will only add paint to them when we antique the car.
- 8. Water down Licorice paint with 50% water to 50% paint.
- 9.To antique the car we are going to work sections at a time by applying the watered down Licorice paint to the creases and then using a brush with clean water to blend it outward. This is going to give that black wash all over the truck. This step feels scary when you start, but trust is it'll look great!
- 10. After you've done all sides of the truck, the windows, etc you are all done.

TIPS

- 3 coats of paint will give you nice solid colors.
- Make sure to water down the Licorice paint so that it's nice and thin with 50% water to 50% paint.
- If you're worried you've applied too much black, take a clean brush with water and rub over it to dilute it out.
